#### **A Reading from the Book of Zephaniah 3:14-20**

<sup>14</sup> Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart,  
    O daughter Jerusalem!  
<sup>15</sup> The Lord has taken away the judgements against you, he has turned away your enemies.  
The king of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more.  
<sup>16</sup> On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands grow  
weak. <sup>17</sup> The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over  
you with gladness, he will renew you in his love; he will exult over you with loud singing <sup>18</sup> as  
on a day of festival. I will remove disaster from you, so that you will not bear reproach for it.  
<sup>19</sup> I will deal with all your oppressors at that time. And I will save the lame and gather the  
outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. <sup>20</sup> At that time I  
will bring you home, at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised  
among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes, says  
the Lord.

## **The Second Lesson: The Gospel of John [21:15-17]**

She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.
