and with all your soul


and with all your mind

1 Corinthians 13:1-13


A Reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.



March- Leadership workshops in Springfield; youth spaghetti dinner as a fund-raiser for their

worked on that massive project within the larger Milford community.

churches.

September- the community meal is now hosted by Trinity on Wednesday.

October- the popular "Chocolate Fest" fund raiser.

November- the covenant service held with St. Mary's Catholic Church.

December- the Christmas Faire fund raiser and services Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

At the conclusion of the worship service, a pot luck brunch was served as parishioners settled into the business portion of the Annual Meeting.

EDUCATION AND SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

Terese Cook, Vestry Liaison

Children's Christian Spiritual Formation

The Trinity Children's Christian Education program has continued with a curriculum based upon the "Weaving God's Promises" curriculum that we started last year. The packaging of these lessons provides numerous activities that are great for our base of learners. Add in a little customization and a successful lesson plan appears! This year we have official registration of 43 boys and girls a 24% drop in census compared to last year. Our weekly average of participants is approximately 17.

So far this year our "kids" have explored the Book of Common Prayer, the visit of angels revealing the wondrous news of the Christ Child, and we ended the year bringing the story of the birth of our savior by having fun with several new advent crafts and activities. In the coming weeks will we will learn of the Baptism of Jesus and Christ's Ability to Heal the Sick. We will address the Lenten season discussing mission work and review Jesus and his disciples journeying in to Jerusalem for the Passover.

The program is a success because of the children who come each week, eager to learn and share their thoughts on how God's love is all around them. This audience along with the dedication of a handful of consistent volunteers is what makes the program a reality.

What could make the program a bigger success? A larger pool of volunteers; any volunteer will be greeted with open arms. The activities are planned out, the materials are available, and there are absolutely NO requirements for you to be a biblical scholar! We start each Sunday with a review of the Module theme and then break into age appropriate groups for the day's activities.

Altar Guild

This year's Lenten Project collected funds for the Diocesan Mission Trip to the Dominican Republic. Thank you to everyone who filled a box or made a donation.

Trinity participated in the Milford Area CROP Walk again this year. It is the fourth year the walk has been held in Milford. Through Church World Service, twenty-five percent of the funds raised remain locally. The remainder helped Church World Service's many programs.

This year with Parishioner's help we collected 24 boxes filled with items for children of different ages, as well as the \$7.00 needed for each box to cover shipping expenses. The shoeboxes were delivered to a drop off collection point at the First Baptist Church in Holliston. From there they were then transported to Boone, North Carolina and from which they were delivered to various parts of the world. Thank you to everyone who filled a box or donated to Samaritan's Purse for the shipping expenses. We hope next year to have the same number or more.

Obviously gifts to the poor are its primary purpose. Within "other charitable and pious purposes" includes gifts to any recognized charitable organization (the same ones to which an ordinary individual could make a deductible gift), to the church itself and for certain items such as vestments, books, and other professional items which will remain the property of the church when the priest leaves.

The origin of discretionary funds lies in Title III, Canon 14(f) of the National Church, dating back to 1814, which states:

"The Alms and Contributions, not otherwise specifically designated, at the Administration of the Holy Communion on one Sunday in each calendar month, and other offerings for the poor, shall be deposited with the Member of Clergy in charge of the Congregation or such other Church officer as the Member of the Clergy in charge shall appoint to be applied to such pious and charitable uses as shall be thought fit by the Member of the Clergy. When a parish is without a Rector, the Vestry shall appoint a responsible person to serve as Almoner".

While it is now often customary to supplement the discretionary fund with gifts from individuals and also from the church's general operating funds, one item is of particular importance in the Canon. The words "alms", "contributions" and "offerings" are used, which clearly mean that these are funds given to the church and which therefore belong to the church.

Trinity's Discretionary Fund (TDF) is funded primarily from gifts from parishioners designated for the "TDF." In addition all gifts given associated with Baptisms, Marriages and Funerals are used to fund the TDF.

Trinity's Children's Choir sang and Trinity's Adult choir was joined by St. Mary's Choir Director Robert Blake and several of his choir members. A joyful time was had by all.

They may also be interested in looking at pictures of parish activities, or reading more about parish groups or our history.
- Casual online visitors: Family members (grandparents, aunts, uncles and so on) who live outside the area may use the website to see pictures of the Christmas pageant or other activities.

Take pictures: We always want pictures of Parish activities. If you take pictures, please consider mailing them to me or to the office. If you have old pictures, even better – we'd love to add them to our history page. We'll be happy to scan them for you.

Mutual Ministry Review

Trinity conducts a Mutual Ministry Review (MMR) every other year. In such a review, the ministry of the clergy, vestry, other lay persons, and that of the total congregation, all of whom are deeply involved in the quality of the total ministry of the parish is reviewed. The objective of the MMR is to establish a relationship between clergy and the members of the congregation which creates an environment of mutual trust and confidence for a stronger joint ministry. This year our MMR will include a post Sabbatical review. Fr. Mac will be sharing the results of the work he did during his Sabbatical, working with social service organizations in the area, assessing needs and concerns and looking at new directions in which Trinity can minister to the neighbors around us.

The goal is to inform about upcoming events and to inquire about needs (or prayer requests) for which the Church (specifically Fr. Mac) could be of help. The committee achieved its goal. New Members for 2013: I'd like to welcome Rick Nelson, Rob Nelson and Steve Masse officially to the Property Committee, and look forward to working with you!

Property related issues for 2012 weren't as exciting as our steeple renovation last year, but as we discover, there's always something to fix or replace. The following items were completed in 2012:

- The oil burning forced hot air furnace that supplied heat to the church failed in October, and was replaced with new twin natural gas-fired units in December.
- The existing oil-fired burner supplying heat to the parish hall and offices was also converted to natural gas. The cost savings converting from oil to natural gas is expected to be a few thousand dollars per year!
- Dick Kosiba and Father Mac built a deck (which was designed by Ron Gorham) on the back side of the rectory.
- Dick Kosiba installed new drainage piping for the sump pump in the church basement.
- The rectory bathroom had some leaking around the tub which was repaired.
- Wall switches for the chairlift at the church were replaced by John Ellis.
- Efforts were coordinated with the Landscaping Committee to extensively trim and cut rhododendrons and other shrubbery on the church property. Gravel was also placed under the fire escape to prevent weeds from growing out of control.
- John Ellis re-wired the electrically lighted sign in front of the church after the underground wiring was damaged from removing a rhododendron.
- The church was power washed to remove algae growth, especially on wall areas where shrubbery was trimmed back.
- Dick Kosiba rebuilt the roof over the fire escape as the previous roof structure was rotted.

I'd like to thank Father Mac for always being available to schedule and meet with contractors for various projects, Dick Kosiba for all the "handy" work he does throughout the year, and John Cook, who continues to donate his landscaping services to keep our grass mowed, shrubs trimmed, mulch spread, etc. Many thanks to Cathy Poch, Mille Williams, Beth Stochaj and the Landscaping Committee for involving us with their efforts to beautify the grounds of Trinity Church. I'd like to also acknowledge Rick Nelson, Steve

Masse, Wayne Stochaj and other kind parishioners who have donated their time throughout the year to assist with various projects.

Stewardship

- Fr. Mac's Sabbatical What can be more important than taking care of our spiritual leader! There are a few things that really left an impression on me during this very special time...
 - o Fr. Mac is Trinity's first priest to enjoy a sabbatical in over 20 years! That means he is the first priest to serve 5 years or more at Trinity in as many years! Our diocesan policy requires a sabbatical every five years for clergy and parish wellness.
 - While Rev. Judith took care of our pastoral needs, many people stepped in to take care of things that Fr. Mac would normally do. Special Thanks must be extended to our Sabbatical Committee (Verna Kosiba, Ann Marie Lockwood, Beth Washburn, Steve King, Marty Ploof and Wayne Stochaj), and our wardens Gayle Ruscitti and Anne Marie Lockwood, who really took on extra duty!
- † *The loss of our loved ones* Unfortunately we lost a number of faithful members while Fr. Mac was away. Personally, I was awestruck by the overwhelming love and support that enveloped the families of those who died. As a fairly new member at Trinity, it was so inspiring to hear and witness all that their Trinity friends and family did to help them through this difficult time.
- Pamily Needs Our Help In December a family walked through our doors that had recently lost everything to a fire. We sent an email requesting donations of clothes, bedding, kitchen items, small appliances, etc. The response was fast and overwhelming! In less than two weeks, we had supplied everything the family needed along with some cash and gift cards so they could have a decent Christmas. And to top it off, they were invited to spend Christmas Eve and Christmas Day with Trinity families so they didn't need to be alone!

So back to the question... How do you measure stewardship? With all that we do, is it enough? In the big picture, are we (Trinity) doing our fair share? Could we do more? Could we engage more parishioners so that we do more? For this committee, those are the questions we'd still like to explore.

And one last question... How many of us truly understand stewardship? Many people still think it is about the Annual Pledge Campaign. And many people are still uncomfortable talking about stewardship. It is hardly just about the Pledge Campaign, or just about money. They are just a small piece in the bigger picture.

What is important is to understand why we do what we do... and why we are called to do it. We invite you to join us as we continue to explore the true meaning of stewardship!

Parish Records

My work with our parish records continued through this past year. It has been a large undertaking but one that I am very grateful to be able to work on. I first began with the data base in our computer. Then I moved the parish register books to make sure that all entries are correctly indexed. These are entries that we are required by our church law to maintain. One important and interesting aspect of our record keeping that happened in 2012 was to learn that our federal government accepts church records as proof of identity for a person.

One major issue that arose was that I needed to rebuild the indexes for our first three books - A, B, C. I learned that Book A was never indexed - items were entered in the various events but never added to the index. Book B was a little bit better but much was not indexed. Again, Book C was in better shape but not all things were indexed. By rebuilding these indexes, I have been able to track our earliest members and also see how families grew. As of this writing, I am nearing the end Book E. I have been able to make connections in previous books that were not seen previously.

There will always be something to track and improve as I move forward. As mentioned earlier, I am grateful to be doing this work. I do find it very interesting and know that I am appreciating more and more about those involved at Trinity from the start through now. We are and continue to be a dynamic force in Milford and greater Milford area.


