These smaller plants stayed here at the nursery. They will be given away when they get a little bigger. The youth group collected pails for Good News Gardens then Jon & Charlie turned them into self-watering containers. We will transplant the plants when they get bigger and we will help them find new homes and a new gardener, new people to enjoy and share the harvest. We have about 100 plants here at the nursery. We already found new homes for about 120 plants. Gardening advice is available if anyone has questions about caring for their new plants. 

Meditation for the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord (transferred) May 16, 2021

Through the story of the ascension of Our Lord, we proclaim that Christ's presence fills the universe and all the earth is made holy by God's presence. We proclaim the triumph of God over all the forces of evil; with Christ's rising we are promised

that the power and wisdom of the Holy Spirit will guide us into a new way of being with God on earth.

Rowan Williams has explained, for me, the best way to understand the deepest meaning of this story:

Jesus Christ is the light we see by; we see the world in a new way because we see it through him, see it with his eyes. . . . It means that we think about Jesus not as someone completely outside us [someone who lived a long time ago and whom we will never really understand], but as the power in us gradually setting us free to see the world with clarity, hope, and love. . . His life is being lived in us: the new world is being brought to birth in us, gradually and sometimes painfully . . . In and through Jesus we, too, have become a sign of promise...

The story of the Ascension of Our Lord calls us to *look up*—not to bow our heads. It calls us to find awe and wonder in the midst of sorrow and loss, to watch for possibilities in the act of letting go of what is most familiar to us. It calls us to a bold hope.
