# **Sophie Scrimgeour** A Reading from the Second Letter to the Christians at Corinth [5:6-10, 14-17]

We are always confident; even though we know that living on the earth means being apart from Jesus Christ. We walk by faith, not by sight. Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with Christ. So whether we are at home or away, our intent is to please Christ. For all of us must appear before the judgment seat of Christ, and each of us may will be held accountable for what we have done in the body, whether good or evil. . . .

The love of Christ overwhelms us whenever we reflect on this: that if one person died for all, then all have died. The reason Christ died for all is so that the living should no longer live for themselves but for Christ, who died and was raised to life for us. From now on, therefore, we don't judge anyone by what they have or how they look. Even though we once judged Christ in this way, we no longer look at him in this way. So if anyone is united to Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!

# The Holy Gospel of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ according to Mark [4:26-34] Glory to you Lord Christ

**Nathan Pirelli** Jesus said, "The reign of God is like this: someone scatters seed on the ground, and sleeps night after night and rises day after day, and the seed sprouts and grows without the sower knowing how it happens. The earth produces the crop by itself, first the

stalk, then the ear, then the full grain in the head. When the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come."

Jesus also said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God? What image can we use? It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the largest of all shrubs, and with branches large enough that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

Jesus taught his followers them by using many parables like this, in language that they could understand. He only spoke to them in parables, and he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.

## The Nicene Creed

*Let us say together:* 

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to Christ in his self-offering, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**
