The First Lesson: A Reading from the Book of Deuteronomy [10:17-21]

The Lord your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who is not partial and takes no bribe, who executes justice for the orphan and the widow, and who loves the strangers, providing them food and clothing. You shall also love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt. You shall fear the Lord your God; him alone you shall worship; to him you shall hold fast, and by his name you shall swear. He is your praise; he is

your God, who has done for you these great and awesome things that your own eyes have seen.

The Song of Zechariah [Luke 1: 68-79]

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel; *
he has come to his people and set them free.
He has raised up for us a mighty savior, *
born of the house of his servant David.
Through his holy prophets he promised of old,
that he would save us from our enemies, *
from the hands of all who hate us.
He promised to show mercy to our fathers *

The Second Lesson: The Gospel of Matthew [5:43-48]

Do not even the Gentiles do the same? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect."
