## Venite [Psalm 95:1-7]

Come, let us sing to the Lord; \* let us shout for joy to the Rock of our salvation.

Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving \* and raise a loud shout to him with psalms. For the Lord is a great God, \* and a great King above all gods.

In his hand are the caverns of the earth, \* and the heights of the hills are his also.

#### The Lessons

#### The First Lesson: A Reading from the Book of Proverbs [2:1-9]

2My child, if you accept my words and treasure up my commandments within you,

- <sup>2</sup> making your ear attentive to wisdom and inclining your heart to understanding;
- <sup>3</sup> if you indeed cry out for insight, and raise your voice for understanding;
- <sup>4</sup> if you seek it like silver, and search for it as for hidden treasures—
- <sup>5</sup> then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God.
- <sup>6</sup> For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding;
- <sup>7</sup> he stores up sound wisdom for the upright; he is a shield to those who walk blamelessly,
- <sup>8</sup> guarding the paths of justice and preserving the way of his faithful ones.
- <sup>9</sup> Then you will understand righteousness and justice and equity, every good path;

## **Canticle: The Song of Zechariah** [Luke 1: 68-79]

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel; \*

he has come to his people and set them free.

He has raised up for us a mighty savior, \*

born of the house of his servant David.

Through his holy prophets he promised of old,

# The Second Lesson: The Gospel of Luke [14:27-33]

<sup>27</sup>Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. <sup>28</sup>For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? <sup>29</sup>Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, <sup>30</sup>saying, "This fellow began to build and was not able to finish." <sup>31</sup>Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? <sup>32</sup>If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. <sup>33</sup>So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.

#### **The Song of Mary** *Magnificat Luke 1:46-55*

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior;  $^{\ast}$ 

for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant.

From this day all generations will call me blessed: \*
